Understanding health conditions within Health and Social Care

When applying for jobs across health and social care, researching top health conditions that impact those in your care will help enhance your CV and application. Take a look at the information to find out more about; Dementia, Autism, Mental Health and Diabetes.



Dementia - Dementia is a term for several diseases that affect memory, thinking, and the ability to perform daily activities.

The illness gets worse over time. It mainly affects older people but not all people will get it as they age.

Autism - also known as autism spectrum disorder (ASD), is a developmental disorder which affects social interaction and communication. Autism also tends to be characterised by specific interests and activities which are carried out repetitively.

Mental Health - Mental health is a state of mental well-being that enables people to cope with the stresses of life, realize their abilities, learn well and work well, and contribute to their community.

Diabetes - Diabetes is a fairly common condition, with around 4 million diagnosed cases in the UK and an estimated 850,000 cases which are undiagnosed. This is around 6% of the UK population. Diabetes occurs where the body is unable to use glucose properly and therefore builds up excess levels of glucose in the blood stream.
